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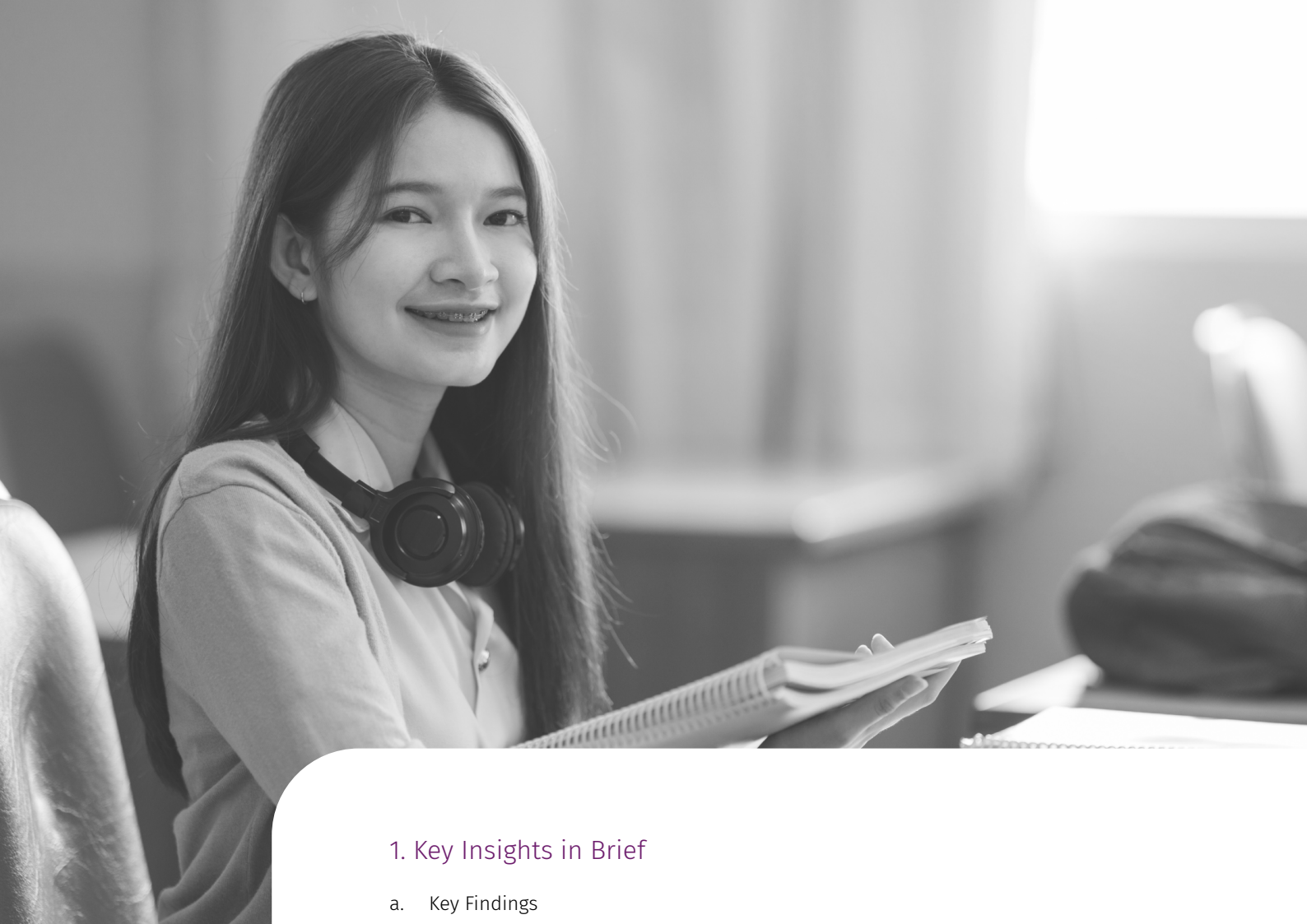

Favored for its historical prestige and diverse academic offerings. The UK's rich history, cultural diversity, and strong academic institutions continue to attract students.

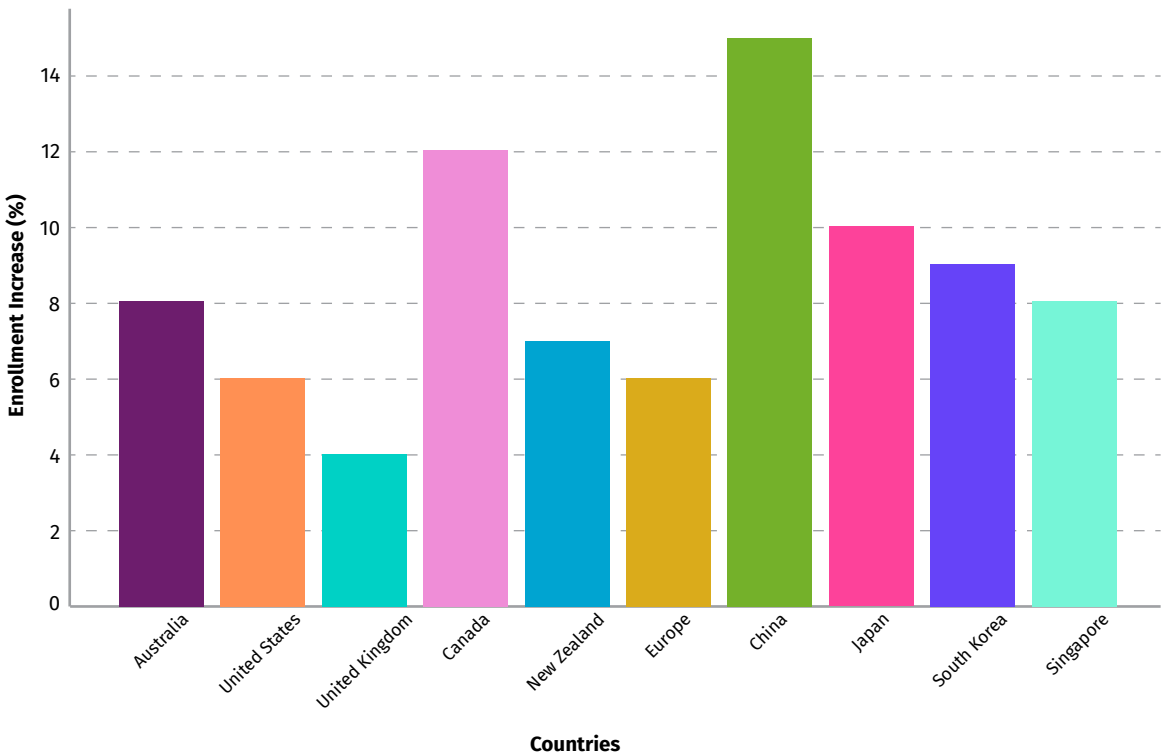
USA:

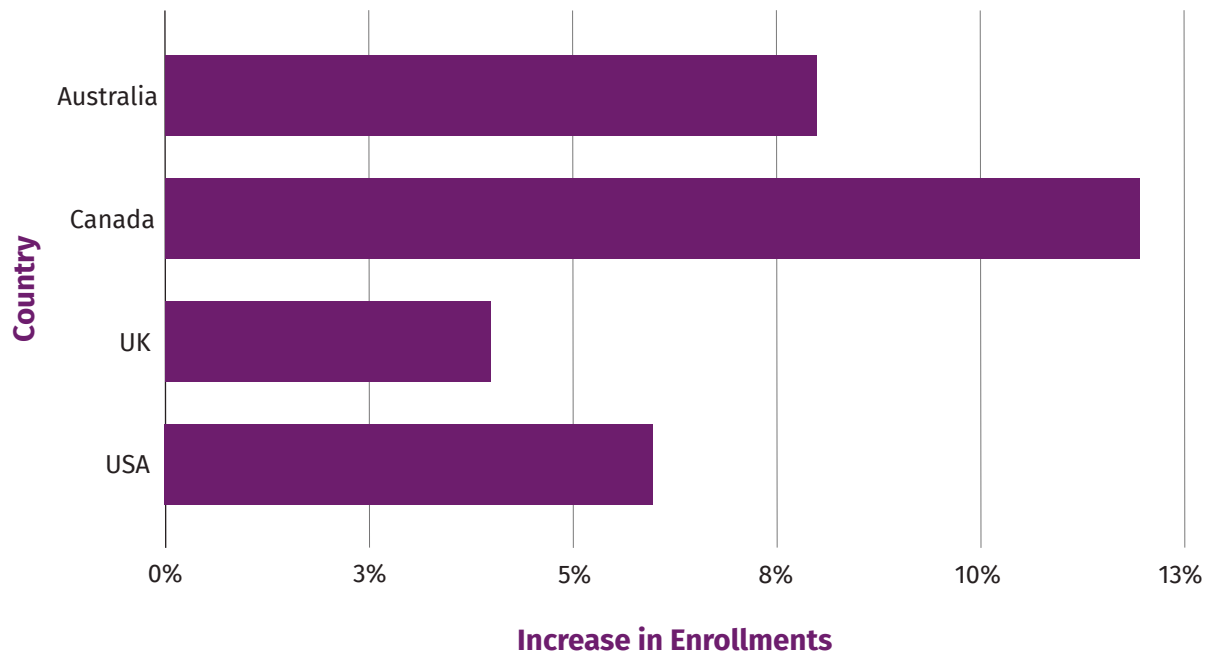

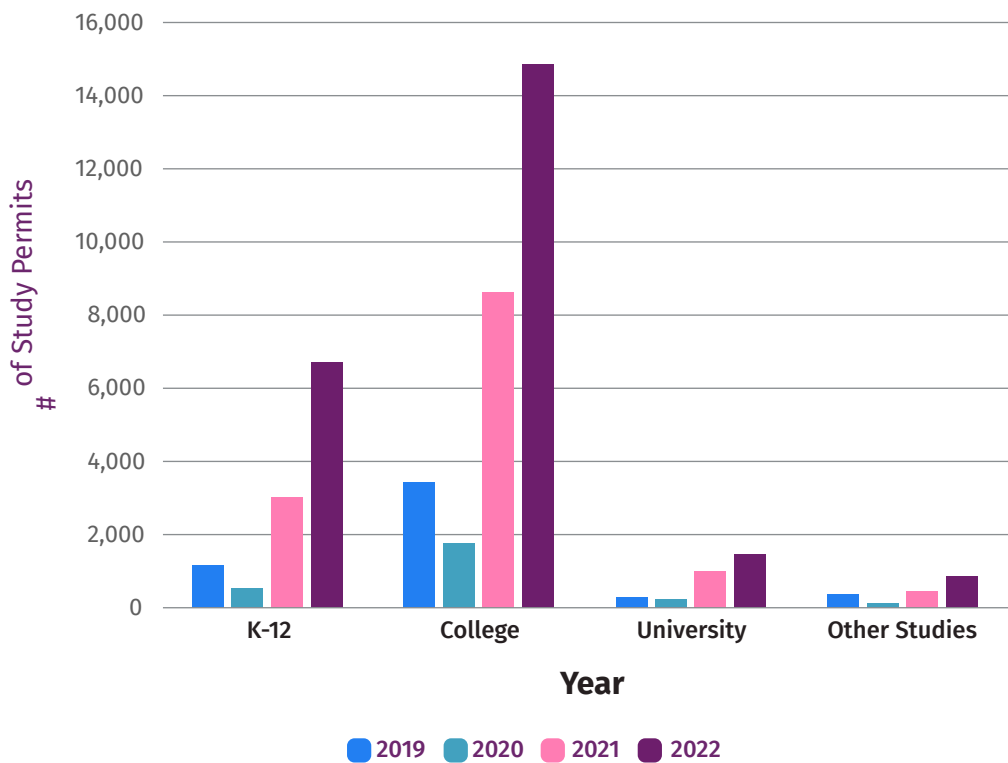
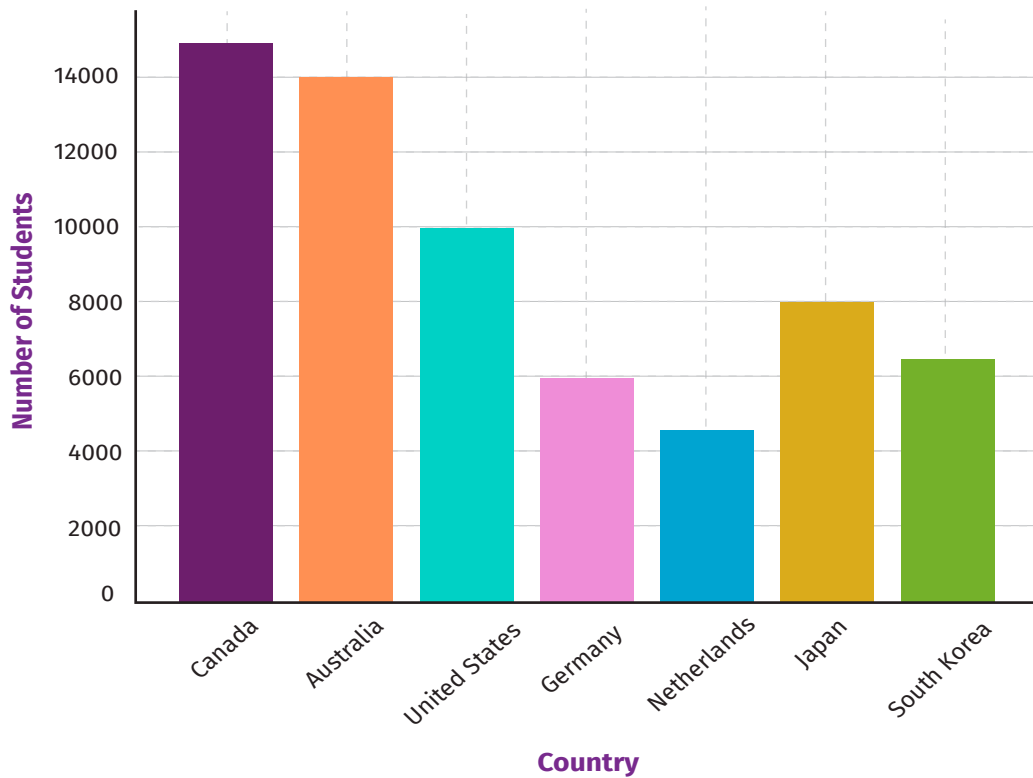

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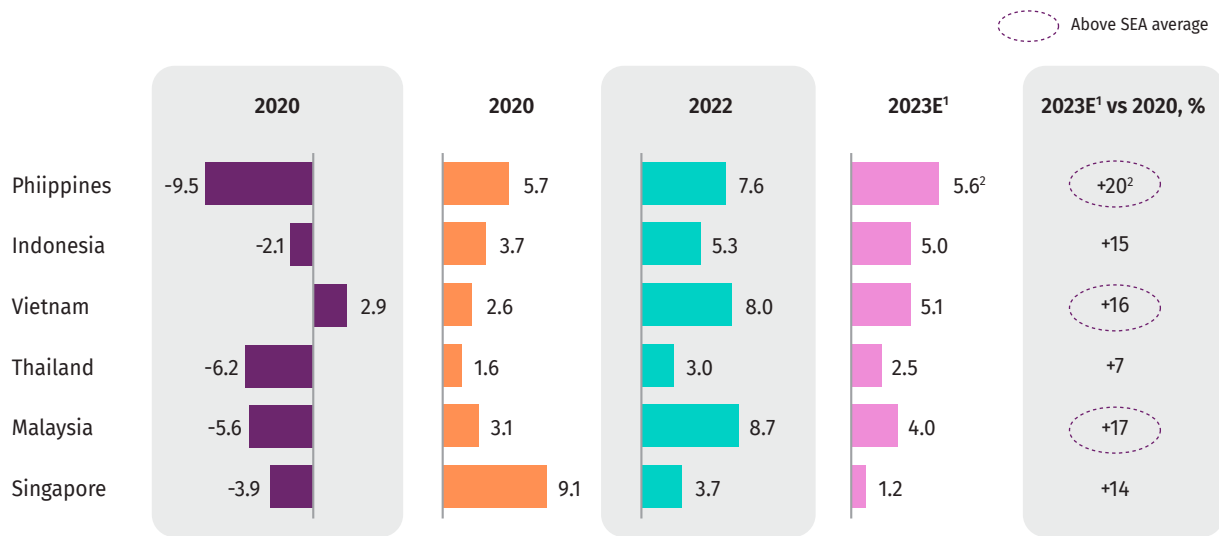

Number of Filipino Students Studying Abroad in 2024

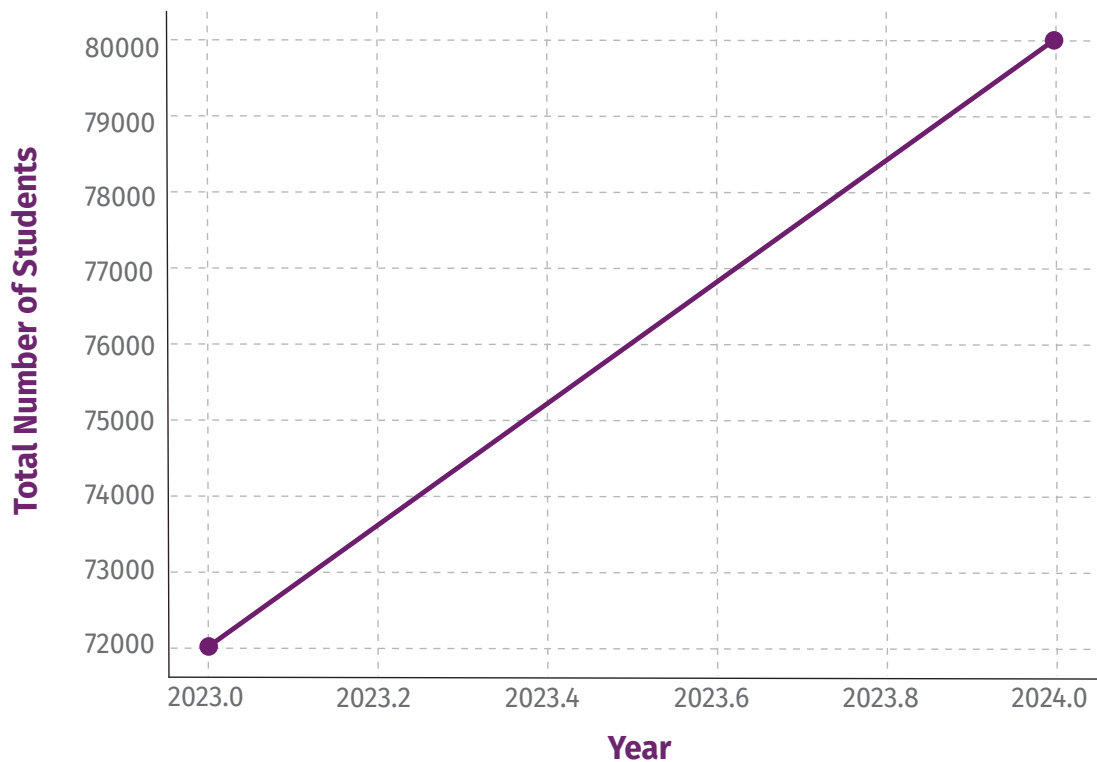


Real GDP growth rate, % vs previous period

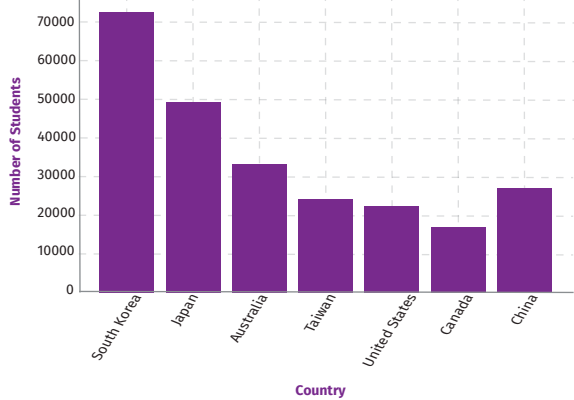

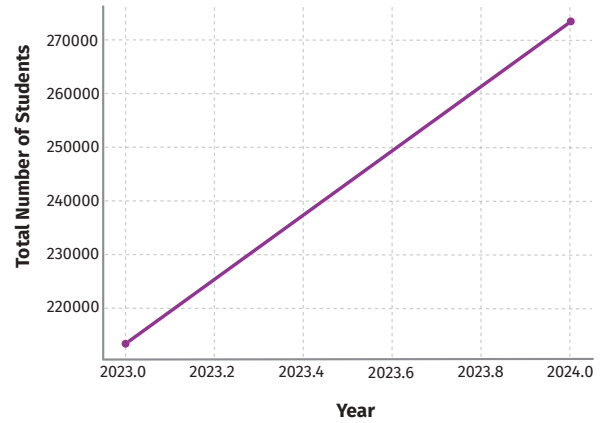

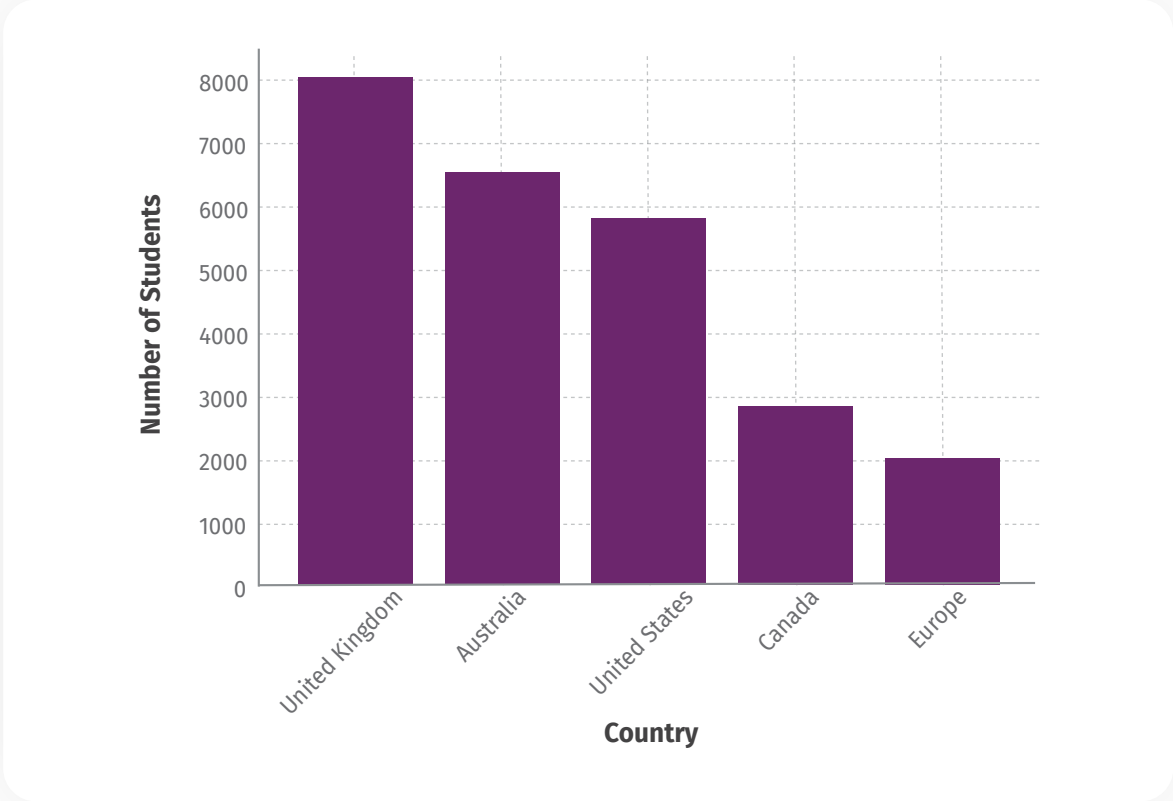

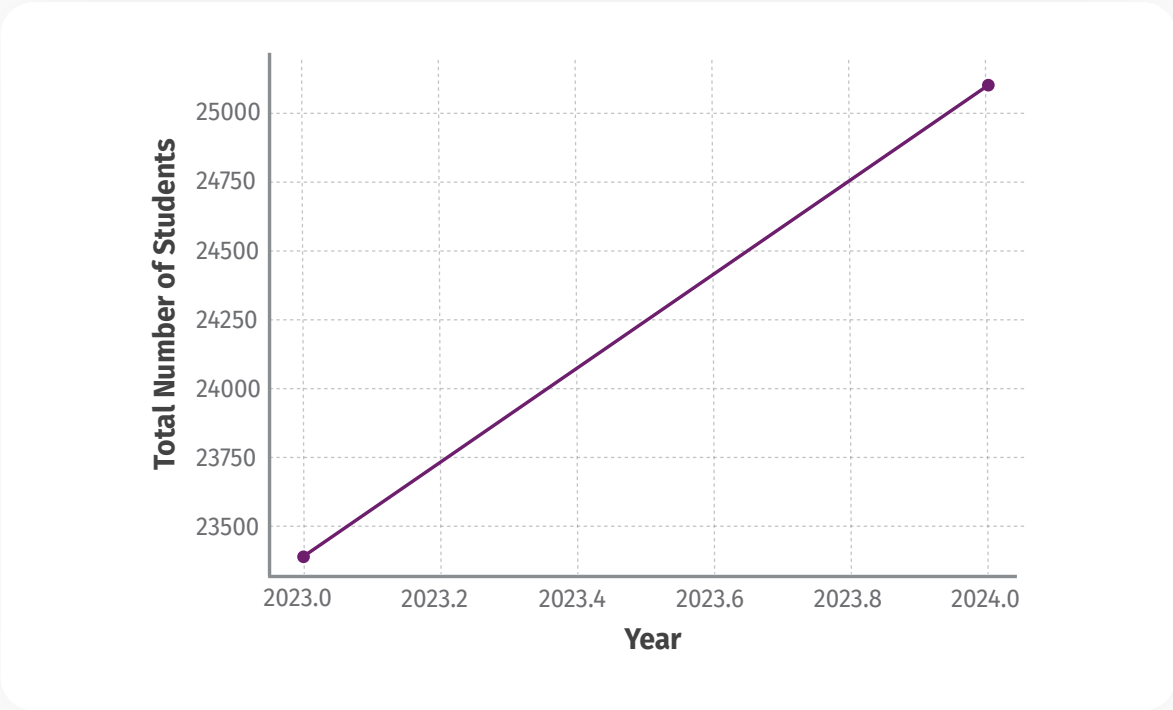

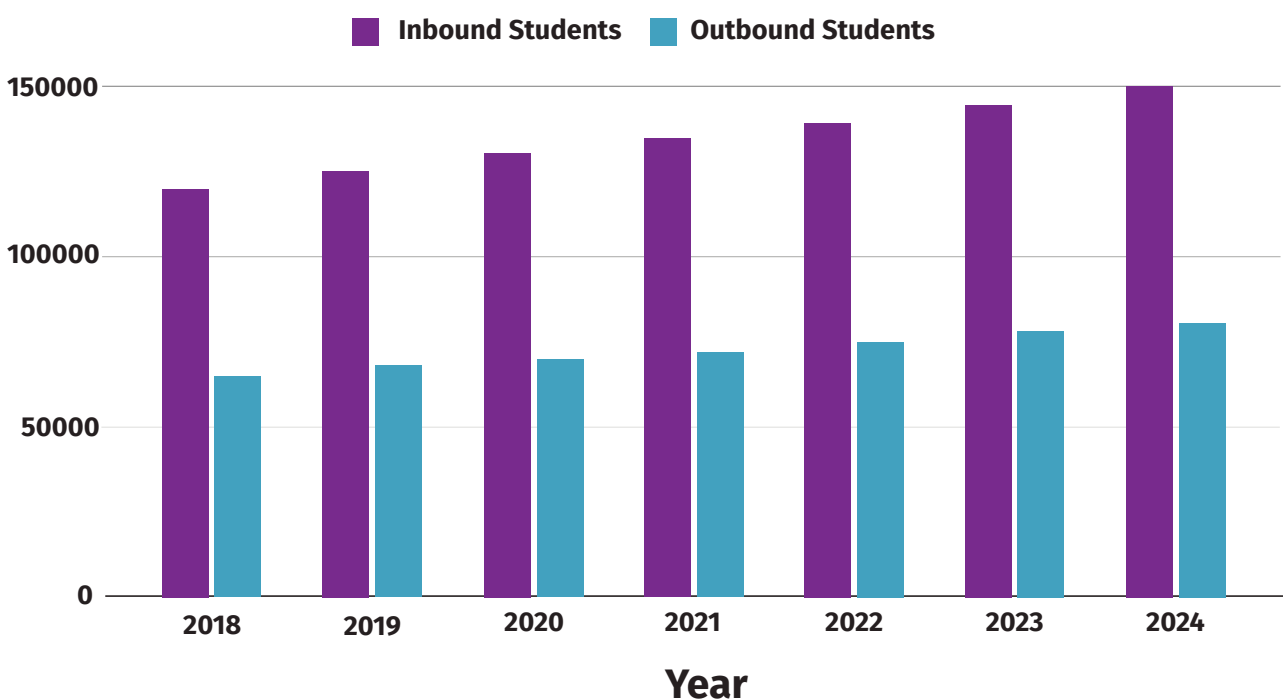

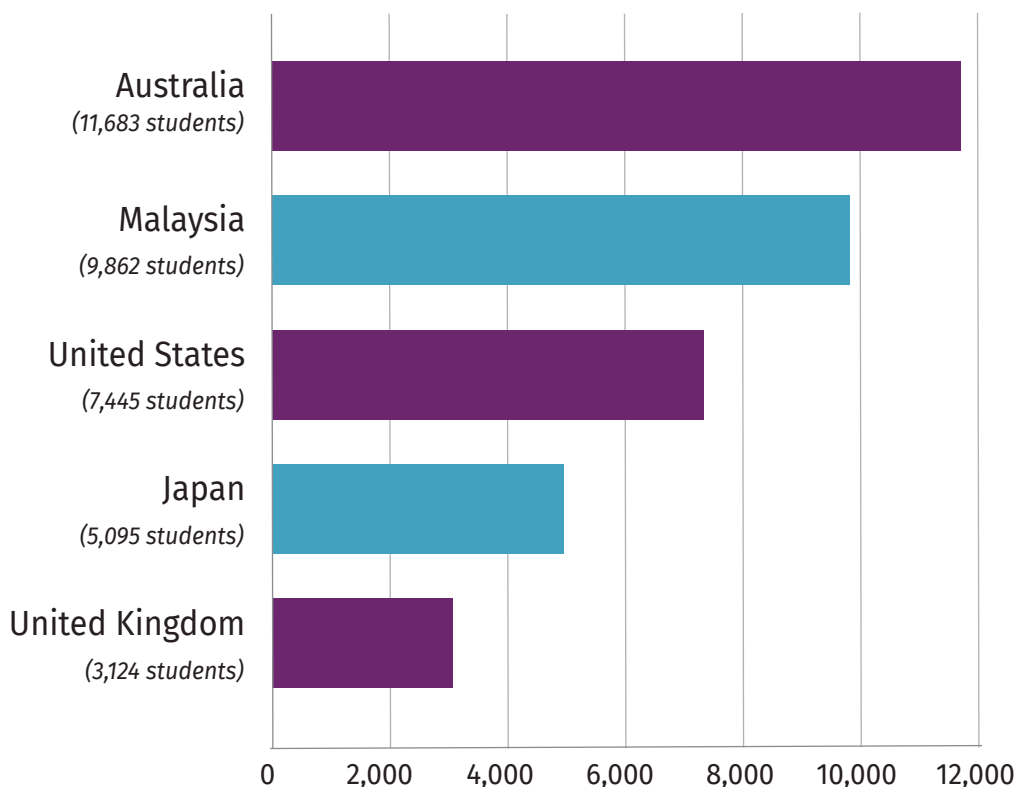

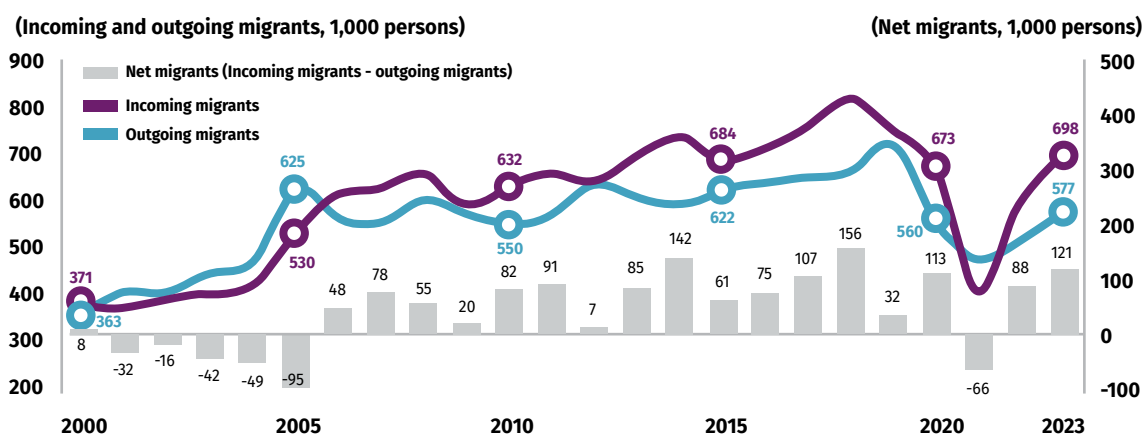
